

Gift Aid

We are awaiting funds in respect of our Gift Aid claim for the tax year 2023/2024. This costs us nothing. If you simply fill in a form, assuming you pay income tax, an additional 25% of your offerings may be claimed by the Church. **Yes 25%**, if you donate just £2 per week for 52 weeks, an extra £25 is claimed free of charge. It's that simple! The more you donate the more the church receives. Just ask Lynne Guthrie for a Gift Aid form and she will give you envelopes so that we can record your weekly amount.



Why not sign up now!? It's free, so long as you are paying income tax. This is an easy way to help the church add to its finances.

Mission and Outreach Committee

The Mission and Outreach Committee has had two very productive meetings since the start of 2024. We fed back on both Christmas & Easter Drop ins for William at the New Parish Playgroup. It was good to hear that both short services were well attended. On both occasions the children were gifted books to take home with them and due to the great turn out more books had to be ordered. The New Parish Playgroup continues to be a great success.

William is now well established as Fergusons Shipyard's Chaplain and has recently been involved with the Glen Rosa launch. He is in on a Monday and things are going well with engagement with the workers. He has been promoting the Lighthouse Group as moral is quite low in the yard at the moment.

A group of representatives of the committee travelled to Fullerton Connections in Irvine to see the great set up they have and they were very impressed with the church and halls. There is a lot going on at Fullerton and it is open every day, much like our own church. They have a church cafe that is open every day, a prayer room, bible study corner, woodland trail and even electronic notice boards to advertise what is on in the church that day/week.

The committee came back with some ideas that we can think of using for our church. Next visit will be to Stuart Davidson who is a pioneering minister from the Ferguslie Park area of Paisley. We continue to try and find other ways to engage those who are not comfortable coming to church. It was discussed on hosting something out-with the church, a neutral venue. We have decided on a Bible Study, from the Bible Society, lasting for eight weeks.

The first weeks discussion is - Introduction to the Bible. Each week has a short video and a study guide. We are hoping to hold it at 7 1/2 John Wood Street, Port Glasgow and tea, coffee and snacks will be provided. We are hoping to begin the course about the week beginning the 14th of May, ending on the week beginning 9th of July.

Old Boys' Union

Not much to report again but will attach the syllabus. It still has to be finalised but hopefully once speakers are confirmed, the syllabus will be completed.

If there is anyone in the Church who would like to do a presentation at the OBU, and I am sure there are many with a good story to tell, please get in touch with me.

I have never reported this before but the OBU dispenses donations to The Church, the Port Glasgow BB Companies and Local Charities on an annual footing, this year we have decided to give £1,700.00 to the following:

Church - £800.00. 2nd Port BB Company £300.00. 4th Port BB Company £300.00. Inverclyde Children in Poverty £100.00. Church Angels Bank £100.00. Dementia Inverclyde Project £100.

This money was accumulated as collections and donations over the last year.

When the OBU was formed in 1906 by the Reverend Herbert Reid M.C M.A., it was formed to take Ex Boys' Brigade boys off the Street, Boys' Brigade boys who had reached 17 years of age, to prevent them from standing around street corners.

Riverside Youth and Training bands take to the stage, conducted by musical director Mark Good, with the Riverside Rookies led by Laura Good.


This year, a special guest will join the action in the form of the cooperation band - the reigning Scottish champion (Championship Section) and a two-time champion band of Great Britain.
